Cicada Mania



The much hyped cicadas are officially here in the DC area and our little nook at Wheelwright Court is no exception. There are cicadas aplenty on the sidewalks, trees, grass and plants. Cicadas won't hurt people or pets - though if your pup eats too many, it may give him/her an upset tummy.

Cicadas provide a service for many trees by laying eggs in their branches - weak branches wither and die, thus pruning the trees and making them healthier. In some cases, younger, weaker trees may die due to this pruning. If you are concerned about a young tree in the neighborhood, cicadas can be removed by spraying the tree with water or picking them off.

If you are squeamish about cicadas but still want to enjoy the outdoors, a walk in the woods is probably your best bet. Cicadas prefer the edges of woods and grassy areas probably because young cicada nymphs need tiny grass roots to feed on. It may seem ironic, but a walk on the wooded paths is probably the best way to keep the bugs at bay!

New Fairfax County Rules for Yard Waste



Effective March 1, the county began requiring that all residents who utilize a curbside collection service for yard waste use paper yard waste bags or reusable containers to dispose of grass, leaves and brush.

Yard Waste pickup for Wheelwright residents occurs on Wednesdays mid-March through mid-December. Please place your yard waste in paper bags curbside for pickup.

DESIGNATED BATHROOM AREAS FOR DOGS

Please direct your dogs to the mulched areas in the lower and upper clusters to do their business. Additionally, dogs can go to the bathroom along the sidewalks on Olde Crafts Drive to the left and right of the entrance. And always remember to pick up after your pup! Thanks for being a thoughtful neighbor!



FRONT YARD BUSHES

Please be sure to trim your front yard bushes back from the sidewalks. Many bushes and shrubs are blocking part or all of the walkways and making it difficult for people to pass through.



GLASS DISPOSAL

Glass is no longer an accepted item for the regular recycling bins in Fairfax County. All glass CAN be recycled in the large purple bins at locations throughout Northern Virginia. The closest to us is the Reston South Park and Ride towards the rear of the parking lot. If you are unable to recycle your glass in the purple bins, please discard them in the regular trash.
