Concrete Work

Bright Construction Group will be doing sidewalk repair work in the cluster on **Monday, November 16th**. Cluster work will include several sections of sidewalk in front of 2201 all the way around the corner to 2221. If portions of the sidewalk in front of your house will be worked on, you will receive a notice and may need to move your vehicle(s) for the duration of the work.

Tree Work

Cluster work is scheduled for **December 1st-3rd**. If your parking space is needed by the tree company, you will be notified and your vehicle(s) may need to be moved for the duration of the work.

If you are interested in having trees on your property trimmed or pruned, you can contact [JL Tree Service](#) for a quote. Any work scheduled after December 1st is eligible for their 15% winter discount.

Erosion/Drainage Work

Sunrise Landscape and Design will be completing drainage work to the rear of houses 2251-2255 in early December. If your property will be affected by this work, you will receive notice several days in advance. Additionally, if your parking space is needed by the landscapers, you may need to remove your vehicle(s) for the duration of the work.

Annual Meeting

Please plan to attend the Wheelwright Cluster Annual Meeting on **Monday, December 7th at 7pm**. There are many options available for our homeowners to attend: The large open atrium area in Reston Community Center has been reserved for members to attend in person. Some topics will include electric cars and charging stations, asphalt rejuvenation, glass pickup service, erosion/drainage issues, change in color palette for house siding, and community composting.

October Cluster Cleanup

Some projects that were tackled included removal of invasive plants, replanting vegetation to areas that needed some extra plantings, and spreading wood chips along the bus path.
