Please continue to use responsibly - remember these tips to help our compost bin turn waste into nutrient rich compost:



Additionally, remember to secure the latch on the bin, do not OVERFILL with paper, cardboard, or yard waste. No bioplastics (even if it says compostable) and remember to remove stickers from vegetable and fruit rinds.



Unsure about how to get started with composting? Your best bet is to keep a small composting bin on your kitchen countertop. Once full, empty into larger bin.

DESIGNATED BATHROOM AREAS FOR DOGS

FRONT YARD BUSHES

SIDEWALK SHOVELING
