WHEELWRIGHT SOCIALLY DISTANCED COSTUME PARADE TO BE HELD SATURDAY OCTOBER 31 FROM 4-5 PM.

- > Trick or treaters will gather at the top of the cluster by 2201. Participants will follow the arrows on the sidewalks and maintain a distance of at least 6' between individuals or families.
- > Treat bags will be set up at different stations on tables along the parade route*.
- > A photo station will be set up in the upper cluster where organizers will be happy to take some pictures!
- > Individual house trick or treating will be not be permitted during the parade. We encourage residents to forego traditional trick or treating

Neighbors interesting in watching the parade are invited to view from their porches/front
stoops/yards however all viewers must stay at least 6' away from the sidewalks where

Please consider getting involved in cluster cleanups!

Not only is it a great way to connect with your neighbors, it also helps to increase property values without a lot of financial investment (for example, leaf removal and mulching the bus pathway to Olde Crafts Rd would cost roughly \$725 for our landscaper to provide materials and labor - by doing the labor ourselves, we can save as much as half the cost!) Projects generally range from spreading mulch and planting to larger projects like building the Little Free Library. There is something for everyone at cluster cleanups. Hope to see you at one soon!

Homeowner Tree Work



Wheelwright Cluster is working with JL Tree Service to prune, trim and remove unhealthy or dying trees. Cluster work is scheduled for December 1st-3rd. If you are interested in having trees on your property trimmed or pruned, you can contact [JL Tree Service](#) for a quote. Any work scheduled after December 1st is eligible for their 15% winter discount.

GLASS DISPOSAL

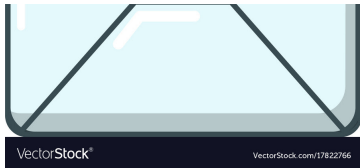
